



What is Equipment Insurance?

- Protects your ham radio investments
- Homeowners/renters policies
- Specialty ham radio insurance providers
- Equipment-specific riders

Financial Protection

- Replaces or repairs gear if damaged or stolen
- Reduces out-of-pocket expenses
- Peace of mind during travel or field operations

Specialized Policies

- Some providers understand ham gear (e.g., ARRL insurance partners)
- Faster claims for specific equipment
- Tailored coverage for antennas, radios, accessories

Cost of Insurance

- Annual premiums may be costly for casual operators
- Deductibles can reduce value of small claims

May not be cost-effective for inexpensive setups

Limited Coverage

- Homeowners policies might exclude hobby gear
- Damage due to negligence may not be covered
- Field operations or contests may not be insured

Alternative Options

- Secure storage and surge protectors
- Portable cases and gear tags
- Keeping detailed inventory and receipts
- Club insurance (for group-owned gear)

ARRL Insurance (AMBA)

- □ The Ham Radio Equipment Protection Program gives you the coverage you need and has a *low deductible of \$250* per claim. The Plan pays to replace your covered equipment when it's lost, damaged or stolen.

ARRL Insurance (AMBA)

- Is there coverage for equipment I am borrowing?
- When you borrow someone's equipment, then you must add the item to your policy and add the owner as a loss payee on your policy for that item. Then, if you lose or damage it, the policy covers the cost to repair or replace it.

Final Thoughts

- Insurance is worth considering if:
- You own high-value gear
- Operate in risky environments
- Want peace of mind
- But may not be essential for all operators
